September highlights

Reception year

Reception have settled into school life beautifully. They have been making lots of new friends and enjoying a range of activities, including number hunts, talking about ourselves and learning lots of new sounds. They have really enjoyed exploring and using our outdoor learning environment and are learning to share, take turns and listen carefully to others.

Year 1 have settled in beautifully to Key Stage One and we are proud of all they have achieved so far.

This half term Year I have enjoyed participating in our whole school Art Day and learning about local painter Terence Cuneo.

We were visited by Chertsey Museum for a workshop about Victorian Toys as we are learning about Toys from the past in History.

As we are learning about The Seasons in Science, we went on an Autumn walk to spot signs of Autumn and drew a picture of the school Sycamore tree which we will observe throughout the year for seasonal changes.











Year two have made a great start to their "Living things and their habitats" topic, by exploring the wildlife garden and identifying familiar plants. We have been working on the scientific skills of identification, classification and recording results. We will be going on to look at how the different living things within the garden are interdependent, and why the garden is a suitable habitat for the plants and animals that live there.





Year 3 have had a fantastic start to the term. All of the children have settled in well and are loving being back at school with their peers. It has been a busy start to the term with lots of learning involved.

This term, Year 3 have really enjoyed our Stone Age topic in History. Earlier this month, the children went on a trip to Chiltern Open Air Museum. During the trip, the children became archaeologists, digging through time and recreating historical evidence. The children enjoyed working out where the artefacts came from in history and what they were used for.

Then, we travelled back in time to the Mesolithic part of the Stone Age and were greeted by Ginny, who was dressed in Stone Age clothing. She took us through the Stone Age and taught our young historians how to create fire with flint and cotton wool, built shelters using wood and animal skin and put their artistic skills to the test where the children created Stone Age Cave paintings using charcoal and vegetarian animal fat. The children came away with lots of sticky learning and eager historians! They have really begun to understand how life changed during the Stone Age and how people used to live in their time.













In Science the children have been investigating rocks, how they were made and the properties of each of the types. Last week, we had a Geobus workshop that was run by UCL and we discovered the three different types of rock and the rock cycle! The children learnt about different types of rocks we see in everyday lives and how they are used. We even got to use 3D glasses to compare rocks and their properties. The children really enjoyed learning about the rock cycle and we look forward to continuing with our learning about rocks!

In Music, the children have begun to learn all about Handel and his famous Oratorio called The Messiah. The children have begun to learn about our key composer and the types of music he composed. The children are learning to create call and response phrases in groups.

In Computing, the children are learning about the importance of being safe online. In Year 3, we considered what is a strong password, how it keeps us safe and the types of confidential information they need to keep private.











Year 4 have enjoyed getting to know the character Edward Tulane, the main character from our focus text 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane' and have been busy making predictions about what his 'miraculous journey' might entail. Since the beginning of term, we have also written a letter from the perspective of Abilene, Edward's owner, as well as a character description of his alias, Susanna. The children have come up with some insightful inferences and have demonstrated their excellent vocabulary in spoken and written English so far, as well as performing their own 'Reader's Theatre' production of Chapter 5 on 21st September.

We have also used glockenspiels to perform a piece of music as part of our Roman topic on 16th September. The children learned what musical motifs are and how to identify them, before incorporating motifs into the Road Building Song'











When we returned to school in September, we were delighted to see some beautiful sunflowers that had sprung up since we had left. Back in the months leading up to the summer holidays, our green-fingered children had prepared a planting area, sowed some sunflower seeds and regularly watered them to ensure that the plants remained healthy. The children were excited to see the fruits of their labours and to see all of their hard work pay off.





This month we have been fortunate to have a local author, Cath Howe, working in class with us on poetry. We have been using her novel 'Not my Fault' in class to support our English lessons.





We had a fantastic Art Day earlier in the month, focusing on a local artist, Terence Cuneo. We used his rail art as inspiration to create our own abstract art. Take a look at some of our wonderful pieces below.









Year 5 are learning cricket this half term and we have a wonderful coach to teach us. Our teachers are also joining in and we are all really enjoying the sessions!

Miss Laidlaw, a music teacher from Salesians has begun to teach us all how to play the ukulele in our music lessons. Some of us are finding it quite challenging but we are putting our growth mindset lessons into practice and persevering.











Year 6 have really enjoyed weekly cricket sessions in PE run by Surrey Cricket Club. The children have enjoyed developing a variety of skills including throwing on target, both under arm and over arm as well as fielding techniques. The children will continue to develop these skills and more over the coming weeks.

Year 6 also enjoyed creating some drama in RE where they explored the story of the Prodigal Son. The children explored the ideas of unconditional love and forgiveness and confidently expressed their own views on the story. They then shared their drama with the rest of the year group.

Penalties for absence from school

Please see below a message we have been asked to share from Surrey County Council:

Please can we remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not need to be consecutive), they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

Please also find attached a letter from Surrey County Council regarding this.

Parking and road safety

Since we have returned from the summer, the school office have unfortunately received a number of complaints from our local neighbours regarding parents parking across driveways/parking inconsiderately. There is plenty of space along Beauchamp road and surrounding roads for parking, please can you park safely and avoid blocking driveways. Please also refrain from stopping on the yellow zigzag lines outside the school to drop off and pick up children.

Where possible walking or riding to school is the best option as this not only reduces the traffic/pollution in the area but boosts wellbeing and fitness.

The school is committed to improving the road safety outside the school. Last year the St Alban's Green Team wrote to the local MP Dominic Rabb to request a road safety audit. This letter sparked action and a Road Safety Audit was performed on Friday 24th September. We are awaiting the outcome of the review and hope to see some positive change which will make the road safer for all users.



Admissions information

Secondary school admissions

Year 6 parents/carers please note that the secondary school online admissions system is now open. The deadline for applications is 31st October 2021 but it recommended to submit your application by Friday 22nd October 2021 (before half term). Applying on time gives you a better chance of getting one of your preferred schools.

The quickest and easiest way to apply for a school place is online at surreycc.gov.uk/admissions.

Once you have submitted your application you will receive a confirmation email.

You can download ParentComms to your mobile device to receive notifications about your application.

To request a paper application form or other enquiries, you can call 0300 200 1004.

Reception 2022 admissions

Recently, we have hosted three open mornings for prospective Reception 2022 parents and have a new date in the diary for **Friday 12th November 2021**. It is a two-part application process

- **1. Online application** made via Surrey County Council (SCC) admissions www.surreycc.gov.uk/admissions, from **1st November 2021.**
- **2. The Supplementary Information Form (SIF) for 2022–23** (available to download from our website) must be completed and returned to the school, together with any supporting documentation e.g. baptism certificate etc. Please note that all documents relating to the SIF should be given to us at the same time.

We welcome these completed forms with immediate effect.

Please can we ask that you scan and return your completed paperwork to us at admin@stalbans.surrey.sch.uk. If this is not possible, you can hand deliver your completed paperwork to the post box outside the school gate (not to the school office). Or you can send it to us through the post.

Once processed, we will confirm receipt of your application.

The deadline for applications (both parts) is STRICTLY 15th January 2022.

SCC make offers via email/online/letter on 19th April 2022.

Places must be accepted or declined by 4th May 2022, at the latest.
