Reception

This half term we have been learning about farms. The children have been excited to learn all about the animals that live on farms and what their roles are. Some of us knew how cows help the farmer by making milk, sheep provide wool and horses' manure helps to grow the crops. We have had great discussions about animals and their babies. We tried to name all the different types of young and match them to their parents. This term we were lucky enough to go to a real farm! We had lots of fun at Bocketts farm meeting the animals and stroking some of them. We went on a tractor ride and spotted the animals that live out in the fields. At the end of the day we got to see the pigs racing each other. We waved flags and cheered on the different pigs that had some funny names! We have had some special visitors from CAFOD who came to tell us about a boy called Musa from Bangladesh. We discussed how his life is different from ours and we learned a song about human dignity.





<u>Geography – The UK</u>

We have been looking at the UK this term in Geography. We have found out lots of exciting features of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. In class, we have explored these features using iPads, maps and atlases.







Art - Lines

Our focus in art has been lines. We have looked at the artists Bridget Riley, Etal Adnan and David Hockney. We explored using horizontal, vertical, diagonal as well as wavy, straight and cross-hatched lines. We have then gone on to create our own line art work inspired by these artists.










English - poetry

In English, we've been studying Tony Mitton's poem *Voices of Water.* We used our senses to describe how it looks and sounds and then portrayed it using different art mediums before performing it.











<u>Science – material</u>

Continuing with our materials topic, we've been looking at different properties. We used our scientific knowledge to set up a fair test to explore the most suitable material for an umbrella.









Year 2 have had a great half term learning all about the Victorians. We have been learning about Queen Victoria and her reign. The children have enjoyed learning all about what life was like in Molesey during the Victorian era.

Museum of Rural life

As part of their history learning about life in Victorian times, both year 2 classes visited the Museum of Rural Life in Farnham. They took part in workshops about housework before electricity, and dressed up as Victorian children before being taught in the authentic Victorian classroom. During the trip, they then had time to enjoy exploring the extended Museum site, which includes reclaimed buildings from all around Surrey.





DT/Science

The children have been learning about what it means to have a balanced diet. The children have been exploring the Eatwell plate and the importance of making sure we have a balanced diet and exercise. The children have designed and created a healthy snack for them to have which includes different parts of the Eatwell plate. They considered what food groups should be in their snack and the cost of purchasing the items. The children have used their food skills including chopping and grating and have created yummy healthy snacks.



This half term in Year 3 the children have been very busy!

Early on in the half term, they got to start their road safety training with Surrey County Council by taking part in walking training. The children learnt all about the Green Cross Code and how to identify different crossings.





As part of our Geography topic the children took part in a workshop with a company who came into school. They learnt about the myths and legends behind why volcanoes and earthquakes came about and recreated the stories through drama. After that they learnt the science and geography behind volcanoes.





Science has been an on going theme throughout this half term. During the first week back we had a great time during Computer Science week where the children had to complete a series of 9 coding missions based on Amazon robots. During this week we also had the pleasure of having some parent volunteers who work in the world of computer science. The children were fascinated to learn about their job roles and hear about real life experiences. They certainly asked plenty of questions!









Our passion for Science continued with a Science Fair with Year 5. The children were given an optional challenge to come up with a Science Fair entry on anything they wished and to share it with Year 5. From this the winning 10 children will be taking their entries to a grand final with all the other Xavier Schools to compete in a larger Science Fair!



On Thursday 2nd March we celebrated World Book Day. It was so lovely to see the children taking part in all the activities and sharing their reading

with others across the school. Year 3's responsibility was to share their reading with the Reception children, they even took part in a quiz all about different book titles.





During our Design and Technology this half term we have been looking at making watering systems for our Wild Life Garden. The children have had great fun exploring how to use gravity to provide the water supply and how we can change properties of materials to benefit our project.













<u>DT</u>

In DT this half term we have designed and made biscuits. The children were given a budget and in groups they worked together to choose a product name and logo and different ingredients. The had to ensure that they were within the budget and that their biscuits would appeal to their customers! The children then worked in groups to follow the recipe and create the biscuits they designed. We were very impressed with the results!



<u>Science</u>

In Science this half term we have been learning about sound. We have carried out investigations into what materials insulate sound the best. We have investigated how to change the pitch of a musical instrument. We also made a string telephones to investigate how sound travels.



RE - Trip to Wintershall

On Monday 27th March Year 4 went to the Wintershall Estate near Guildford to walk the Stations of the Cross. We enjoyed hearing the Bible readings and joining in with prayers and reflections linked to Christ's Passion. Each child brought home a 'pilgrim bag' of mementos from their journey through the Stations of the Cross.

Class Assemblies

Both classes worked extremely hard on their class assemblies and everyone performed confidently, with loud voices and excellent singing.





Art

In Art, we have been learning about Design, Craft and other materials. We have made clay animals using different methods and then painted them. This was a good learning curve for everyone as we had to overcome lots of challenges that the clay presented to us. We have also been studying the work of artist Mark Hearld, then designing and creating our own multi layered birds.









<u>History</u>

We have been finding out all about the ancient Egyptians- we have absolutely loved it! We explored ancient artefacts, discussing their uses and how they compared to artefacts we have learnt about from other ancient civilisations.











<u>Science</u>

We have loved learning about Materials this half term. It has allowed us to use our enquiry skills and work scientifically. We have been able to investigate questions such as 'Which is the best thermal insulator' and 'What happens to solids when combined with a liquid.'









We held a wonderful Science Fair with Year 3, that really showcased our enthusiasm for this subject. There were so many brilliant investigations that has been so wonderfully thought through and presented. 10 children were then chosen who will represent the school at the Xavier Science Fair Final later this month.








Geography




English


World Book Day



Computing

Diving further into the complexities of Scratch Programming, Year 6 have been designing and coding their own games. We have worked hard to iron out any bugs in our code so that our sprites act in accordance with their algorithms.











Art

During Fair Trade Fortnight, we learnt about the Foundation and its aims. We reflected on how we could make an impact and then studied the logo, thinking about how the design had been carefully crafted with poignant symbolism. We felt it had a resemblance to the Yin-Yang which represents harmony and balance. We then created our own logos. In other art adventures, we have painted shells, created self portraits and sketched illustrations inspired by our reading.



















History

Our history topic has continued the themes explored in our English lessons where we have been looking at the history of migration to the UK. We worked in groups to research individuals from Africa and the Caribbean who had been influential in the armed services and presented to our classes. It was fascinating to study a primary source - the passenger list from the Empire Windrush and to hear personal accounts of the journey. We reflected on some heartfelt poetry and tried to empathise with the passengers through writing our own.

Attendance Expectations for This Academic Year

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive) they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

If you feel that your absence should be considered for exceptional circumstances to have leave approved, please complete a 'Request for leave of Absence' form that is available from our school website. The form should be submitted to the school office and at least 2 weeks' notice is required. Please see attached letter regarding Penalty Notices.
