Reception

In Reception we have been learning about Minibeasts. So far we have looked at spiders, grasshoppers, ants and ladybirds. We have learned lots of different facts about them, written about them and made some arts and crafts minibeasts too!

We tried to see if we could jump as far as a grasshopper and used lollipop sticks to try to make the noise that they make with their feet so that we could make a band. We created our own ant colony and labelled the anatomy of a spider. We are looking forward to continuing this topic next half term where we will have some nice surprises for the children.







We have also had a trip to St Barnabas church where we looked at different parts of the church that make it special. For example, Tabernacle, Altar, Pews, Statues, Holy water.











Wisley Trip

This term Year I went on a trip to RHS Wisley Gardens. We explored the gardens and saw all the amazing plants in the glass house and orchard. We then spent some time in a plants workshop where we found out about different types of seeds and planted our own Calendula plants to take home.




Geography


Celebrating the Coronation














D&T

To commemorate the Coronation, the children have been designing and making their own cushion. They learned how to use running stitch to attach the crown.















This half term we have been learning about persuasive writing. The children had great fun learning about Pompeii and using that to create a persuasive advert for a holiday.

This links to our DT project of making our own gnocchi from scratch and designing our own packaging labels.

The children were able to peel potatoes, chop tomatoes and onions, mould and shape the gnocchi into different shapes.





We thoroughly enjoyed our seasonal vegetable hunt around Wisley gardens this half term and the children were really interested in the variety of vegetables that they could see being grown.

Year 3 have been amazing this half term but especially when going swimming. They have all worked incredibly hard and have shown perseverance when learning these new skills. It's so lovely to see their confidence in the water build each week!



Residential to Sayers Croft

At the beginning of term we went on our residential to Sayers Croft in the Surrey hills. We had a fantastic time. We enjoyed taking part in lots of different exciting activities; including an Earth Walk, orienteering, woodland ropes and of course sleeping in our dormitories at night!



We enjoyed carrying out a stream survey and learning more about rivers and streams in preparation for our learning next half term.



We went on a Earth Walk in the Ancient Woodlands and used our Mouse ears' to help us hear the sounds of the woodlands. During the challenge course we had to work together as a team to create bridges out of planks of wood and collect codes for keys to complete the course.





We enjoyed sitting round the campfire one evening, singing songs and drinking hot chocolate!

The children who did not go to Sayers Croft spent 3 days at school in different classes. All of the teachers they visited were incredibly impressed with children and how hard they worked on the different activities across the week.



Geography

Our topic this term has had Year 5 learning about changes to our local area. We have explored a variety of maps through Digi-maps, comparing how things have changed over the years. A fierce debate was waged on whether Heathrow should build a 3rd runway or not. Excellent points were made regarding how it would boost the economy, however increased noise and pollution would negatively impact the local area.












Maths











Computing

In Computing, we have been using an online program called Tinkercad which is used for creating 3D designs. We have placed objects onto the workplane and explored them from different perspectives. For the King's Coronation, we were challenged to use the shapes library to design a crown fit for the celebrations. Oscar T's crown is embellished with sapphires and rests upon a red cushion whilst Casiana has created a display case for protection and features a velvet cap inside the circlet.









DT

This half term, Y6 have been tasked with creating a dessert to commemorate and celebrate King Charles III's coronation. The children have conducted research on the momentous occasion and designed their own packaging for their dessert. Desserts included Victoria sponges, coronation pancakes, British flag cake and cupcakes in the shape of King Edward's crown. Children celebrated together by having a traditional afternoon tea on the last day before half term.

On Thursday 18th May, two of our Y6 pupils participated in the young musician of the MAT competition. They performed in front of parents and headteachers from other Xavier primary schools. Attendance Expectations for This Academic Year

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive) they will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices.

If you feel that your absence should be considered for exceptional circumstances to have leave approved, please complete a 'Request for leave of Absence' form that is available from our school website. The form should be submitted to the school office and at least 2 weeks' notice is required. Please see attached letter regarding Penalty Notices.

Uniform

We would like to remind all our families about our uniform expectations. We expect our children to wear full school uniform and school shoes. Looking and feeling smart, truly does set children up to be ready to learn. Teachers and senior leaders will be checking that appropriate uniform is being worn in school and will be following up with parents if required. We would also like to remind parents and carers of a few key uniform regulations:

- Children must not wear any jewellery (including earrings) as this can pose a health and safety risk
- Trainers should only be worn with PE kit on PE days. On all other days, children should wear school shoes with their uniform Please encourage children to tuck in their shirts and arrive at school looking smart and ready to start the day.
